JÁNOS SZÉKELY (1901–1958) was born in Budapest and moved to Berlin at the age of eighteen to escape the Horthy regime. He wrote numerous screenplays for silent movie stars such as Brigitte Helm, Willy Fritsch and Marlene Dietrich. In 1934 Ernst Lubitsch invited him to work in Hollywood and Székely finally emigrated in 1938. Under the pen name John S. Toldy he was awarded the 1940 Academy Award for Best Story for *Arise*, *My Love*. Persecuted again during the McCarthy era, he lived in Mexico with his wife and daughter for several years, before accepting an offer from DEFA in East Germany in 1957, where he died a year later.

Fiesta, Arias. Nos vamos. A limousine pulls up outside the hairdressing salon on Vallauris' main street. The voice echoing from the passenger seat through the open shop door belongs to Pablo Picasso. Arias, let's go. Voy, voy – I'm coming. I just need to quickly take the curlers out of this lady's hair... and lock up. Minutes later, Eugenio Arias drops into the back seat of the car next to Jacqueline Roque and adjusts his beret. Nos vamos.

To the villagers in the café opposite, this scene – with Picasso in the starring role – must look staged. How can anybody keep him waiting, the king, the man who does not find waiting at all amusing? Yet it is a ritual they have performed for years, the overture to a special occasion. The two Spaniards are going to a bullfight. To Fréjus, to Nîmes, to Arles.

We attended the *corrida* four or five times a year. Picasso always said to me, »Arias, bullfighting is the noblest sport in the world.« »And why is that?« I'd ask. »In bullfighting there is no compromise between the opponents. In football or cycling you can take a bribe to let the other person win. But you can't bribe a bull.«
